Overview

Native food sovereignty is the right of American Indians, Alaska Natives and Native Hawaiians to produce their own traditional foods on their own lands to sustain themselves, their families and their communities.

Aiming to highlight the cultural importance of food sovereignty, I am proposing we hold an educational workshop led by volunteers, Cassius and Dawn Spears, cultural educators, food producers, and tribal food sovereignty advocates.

We would be practicing our Tribal Food Sovereignty by providing our community the ability to *"cultivate, access, and secure nutritious, culturally essential foods produced through ecologically sound and sustainable methods"*

1. Review and share seed starting supplies. In this workshop we will share different types of supplies and use of household materials as well.
2. Topics include: seeds, what to plant, when to transplant, etc...
3. Planting Tips will be shared!
4. Participants will leave with seedlings/ plant starts for their home garden.
